Air Warfare - I Course

Air Warfare-I Course (AW-I) - 10 Hours

AW-I is initiated in September each year. The Air Warfare I course consists of three (3) wars or conflicts in our history. It starts with the Cold War (started after World War II in 1945); the Korean Conflict in the early 1950's; and the Vietnam War which is actually part of the Cold War.

- All Cadets can initiate training after Commissioning and with those that have a rank of at least C/2LT. Adult Advisors may also attend.
- They comprise of approximately 10 hours of classroom instruction, which includes power-point electronic presentation, follow a-long fill-in Learning Objectives, and weekly quizzes/exams.
- *Courses run Through 11 weeks, which has 10 weeks of classroom time, review and taking the last exam on week 11.*
 - 6 Hours – The Cold War
 - 1 Hour – The Korean Conflict
 - 3 Hours – The Vietnam War

AW-I - Training Curriculum Breakdown

- **6 HOURS - The Cold War**

Includes: The Iron Curtain Descends; Strategic Air Command (SAC); Birth of NATO & Warsaw Pact; Cold War over the Ocean; ELINT, Spies and Ferrets; SAC: The B-52 Years: Britain's V-Force; Cold War Air Defences; Aerial Intelligence: The U-2 Years; Cuban Missile Crisis; Central Front Confrontation; Spies in the Skies; Anti-Submarine Warfare; SAC's Last Years; Last Cold War Defenders; Post Soviet Conflicts; Yugoslavia Falls Apart; Bosnia

- **1 HOUR - The Korean Conflict**

Includes: The Early Months; Chinese Invasion; the War of the Jets

- **3 HOURS - The Vietnam War**

Includes: Early American Involvement; In-Country War; Rolling Thunder; The Helicopter War; War Against the Trail; On Yankee Station; Linebacker-I and Linebacker-II

- **2 HOURS - Review / Testing / Evaluation**

Includes: Review of electronic presentation, learning objectives and taking of a 10-15 Quiz or Exam the week after each class.
